Along the way, Julie became a vigorous crusader for people with disabilities and a major driver in the passage of the historic Americans with

Disabilities Act in 1990. This scholarship also honors Julie's Freddie schoolmates who pushed her to school each day; carried her in her wheelchair up and down the stairs; carried her books and gave her constant friendship and encouragement."



Willie, as the

oldest of six children, had to drop out of school to help put food on the table during the depression. Willie, known in the news as the "Freshman Phenom" attracted fans and college scouts from distant counties to watch him play Fullback and Middle Linebacker. Willie is a Charter Member of the FHS Athletic Football Hall of Fame.

Tracie Weller taught Unified Science, Physics, Chemistry, AP Chemistry, and KAP Chemistry for twenty-five years in Fredericktown with passion and enthusiasm. Tracie's AP Chemistry students truly excelled in National testing achieving a full year of college credit at a rate 225% above the national average.

The **Dr. Robert & Patrica Hines Ronk Family Scholarship** - first awarded to a 2024 FHS graduate to help the next generations of Freddie grads with their post-high school educations. "It was such a blessing to grow up in Fredericktown", the Ronks said. "We had good schools, good teachers and coaches that provided us with a safe and encouraging environment. Now that we have completed our work careers, we want to pay it forward to the next generations of Freddies".



History of Gus (Lobby Plaque)

The largest moose killed in the Yukon Territory in 1922 was killed by Helen Wells Struble, wife of R. Y. Struble, and it came to Fredericktown to decorate the walls of the new Dan Struble and Son Bank Building, which opened on April 5, 1924. In 1949, the giant moose head was given to Fredericktown High School and named "Gus" after Dr. Gus Lintner, FHS Vocational Agriculture teacher, who designed the national FFA jacket. Gus was hung near the principal's office and watched over the students and became a target for innocent pranks. In 1964, Gus did not move to the new high school. Custodian, Allen Rine, stored Gus until Dan Snyder, FHS '61, tracked down and refurbished Gus, before he moved to his new home, Judge Otho Eyster's office. Upon his retirement, Judge Eyster, FHS '61, wanted Gus to be returned to FHS to watch over future Freddies, as he did in the 1950's and 1960's. "Bring Gus Home" became part of the FHS Alumni Association's Scholarship Fundraising campaign to provide scholarships for future Freddies. Gus returned to FHS on January 22, 2018.
