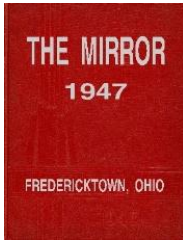

She did not let her disability keep her from her dreams. Before curb cuts, elevators and self-powered wheelchairs, Julie found a way to break through all barriers, thrive as a student at FHS and OSU, and excel in her career as a Speech Pathologist. Along the way, Julie became a vigorous crusader for people with disabilities and a major driver in the passage of the historic Americans with Disabilities Act in 1990. This scholarship also honors Julie’s Freddie schoolmates who pushed her to school each day; carried her in her wheelchair up and down the stairs; carried her books and gave her constant friendship and encouragement.

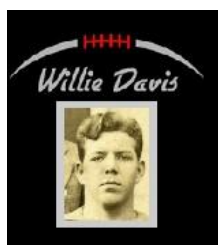

The award, which is presented to an additional new recipient each year, honors the memory of Willie Davis, a Freddie Footballer in the 1929 and 1930 seasons, his Freshman and

Sophomore years. Willie, as the oldest of six children, had to drop out of school to help put food on the table during the depression. Willie, known in the news as the “Freshman Phenom” attracted fans and college scouts from distant counties to watch him play Fullback and Middle Linebacker. Willie is a Charter Member of the FHS Athletic Football Hall of Fame.

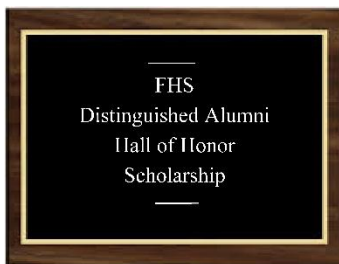

The purpose of this scholarship is to encourage young women to pursue careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) - related fields. Mrs. Gregg taught STEM-related subjects for twenty-five years in the Fredericktown Schools with the goal of inspiring her students to discover their talents and to challenge them to achieve personal success to the best of their abilities.

Tracie's AP Chemistry students truly excelled in National testing achieving a full year of college credit at a rate 225% above the national average.

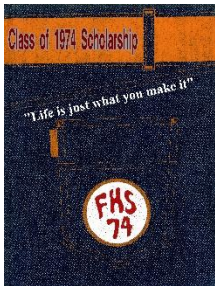

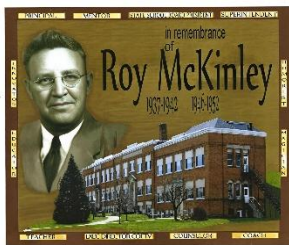
world.

The **“Class of 1974 Scholarship”** - first awarded to a 2025 FHS graduate, was funded by the Class of 1974 on the occasion of their 50th Class Reunion. This Class still holds the record as the largest FHS graduating class with 124 members and was the first to have members travel daily to the Knox County Career Center. The Class members say that it was a blessing to grow up in Fredericktown with good schools, good teachers and a supportive community and decided to establish this “Freddies Helping Freddies” scholarship to “pay it forward” to help the future generations of Freddies.

The **“Roy McKinley Scholarship”** was first awarded in 2008 to recognize the indelible footprints Roy left during a distinguished career as a coach, teacher and superintendent at the Fredericktown schools over a fifteen-year span- 1937-1952. Roy was known for bringing out the best in the students, the teachers and every person in the community that he touched while routinely accomplishing the seemingly impossible. In 2008, a group of Roy’s former students and friends, led by Betty Weller and others, decided Roy’s legacy and teachings needed to be documented for posterity and recognized permanently with a scholarship and a booklet “Footprints of Roy McKinley” which captured personal testimonials of how Roy influenced their lives.

The “**Art & Beverly Dremann Family Scholarship**” was first awarded in 2010 as the Beverly Dremann Educational Award. This scholarship now reflects the entire family’s career contributions in meeting the educational challenges and needs of children. Art and Beverly Dremann together devoted 79 years to working with children in a formal setting and many years as community leaders. Their daughters, Kathy-FHS-76 and Amy, FHS-79, add 78 additional years of service to the young people of North Central Ohio.

It is to also recognize the family members who sacrifice invaluable family time and worry for the welfare of their firefighter.

In 2012 they were Grand Marshals of the Tomato Show parade; and are active in the Fredericktown Historical Society.

The “**Long Family Scholarship**” was first awarded to a 2026 FHS graduate, was funded by the daughter and sons of Rarick W. and Dorothy B. Long- Rebecca `61, John `58, and Harland `65. The Long Family operated the Knox County Citizen weekly newspaper for 35 years and founded the Main Street Free Press Museum in 2000 in The Citizen’s building in Fredericktown. The family hopes this scholarship will encourage FHS graduates to become truth-telling journalists.

The “**Marjorie A. Fearn Scholarship**” was first awarded to a 2026 FHS graduate. Marjorie was the Valedictorian of her 1950 Butler Ohio High Scholl class and settled in Fredericktown to work and raise her family. Throughout her life Marjorie supported many community events and projects. Her impact lives on through this fully endowed scholarship that she established as a caring Freddie- "paying it forward" to help deserving Fredericktown students.
